A Word from the Pastor

June 8th, 2008 is a day that I will remember for the rest of my life. It was very, very hot, especially for early June. It felt the way a summer day is supposed to feel. It was Christian Education Sunday. There was a lot of activity that morning in Worship because there were many different people doing various things in the service. There was recognition and gratitude to be given out for different things.

I preached on images of Jesus that are found in the Gospel of John. There are images like the Lamb of God, the Door, the Light, the Vine and Branches, and the Bread of Life. I see these as daily reminders of Jesus, and ways to remember that he is with us in our everyday lives. But the sermon is not what I will remember from that day.

After Worship we had our church picnic at June Norcross Boy Scout Camp. The food was wonderful as usual. I had a hamburger and a hotdog, and a little bit of ice cream. We were all looking for a little bit of shade.

Then came the time for the baptisms which is what I will remember for the rest of my life. There are a lot of things I enjoy doing as a pastor but of all of them, I feel like my greatest privilege is to be part of the baptism of a brother or sister in Christ. These are moments when it feels like heaven and earth come in contact with one another and in the place and time where this happens, something sacred is created. It is a holy moment, sometimes referred to as a *thin place*. This is my vision of baptism. It is not

just the people in the water who are part of this holy experience, but all the witnesses gathered are participants as well. The people gathered that day were not just witnessing with their eyes, but were joined in heart and spirit. What a wonderful, once in a lifetime experience it was for me to baptize Ethan Fulton and my daughter, Olivia Baker. I am thankful to have my church family here at the First Baptist Church of Mansfield to share in this with me.

I really enjoy listening to rain, sitting beside a running stream or river, or on the sand beside the ocean and listening to the rhythm of the waves. We know that a person can live much longer without food than without water. Water is vital for life. It is a symbol of life. The symbol of water is important to our faith. We see it is the waters of baptism, and in our everyday lives. In

John 7: 38 Jesus announced, *"If anyone is thirsty, let him come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me as the Scripture has said, streams of living water will flow from within him."*

May you see the reflection of Jesus in the water you use everyday, and in the water you enjoy on your summer vacation. In that, may you experience a *thin place*, where heaven and earth come together.

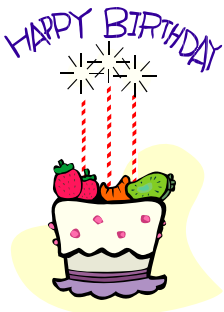
